Notes from the Co-Director

I last directed Wizard over 20 years ago (that was a stunning thing to realize!), and I've wanted to bring the show to Jonesboro for a while now. It seems that the time was just waiting for me, because the right cast, and in abundance, suddenly appeared for the auditions and overwhelmed all of us on the production staff with their talent. Musicals, which here for the last several years have been presented in March due to many scheduling challenges, have their own hurdles, including keeping a cast together during 4-6 weeks of down time between auditions (early November) and full-on rehearsals (Jan. 2). Essentially, every year, we have 7 or 8 weeks to put these complex works together; this cast has shown up not just for added vocal and choreography rehearsals but in large numbers for set construction days. They have been remarkable in so many ways, and the show you'll see is the result of a team pulling together and putting their hearts and work out there to create a labor of love.

Thanks to Jennifer, my partner in this effort, for her talent, patience, calm demeanor, dedication, and hard work. No one could ask for anyone better to share the directing duties! Thanks also to Anne Marie and Izzy for the creativity and hard work on her choreography; and


